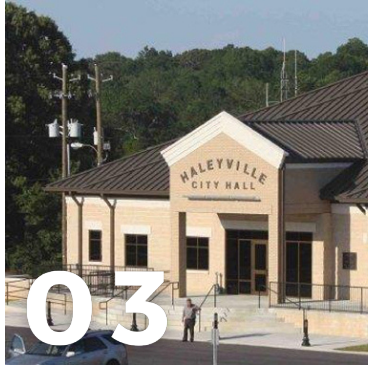

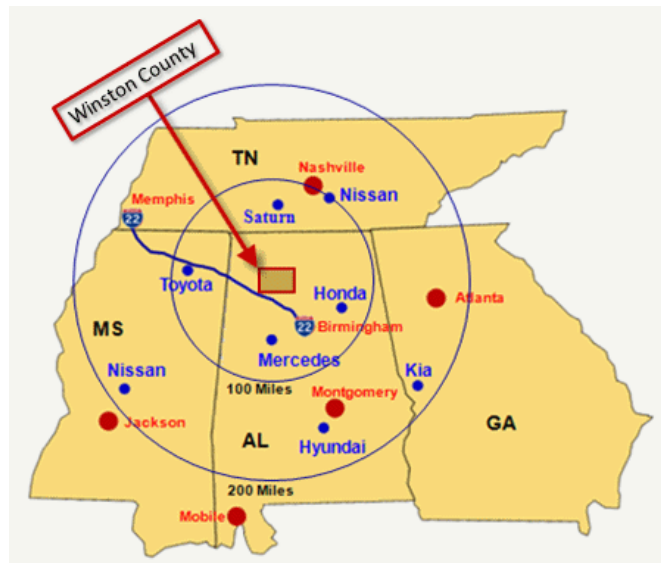

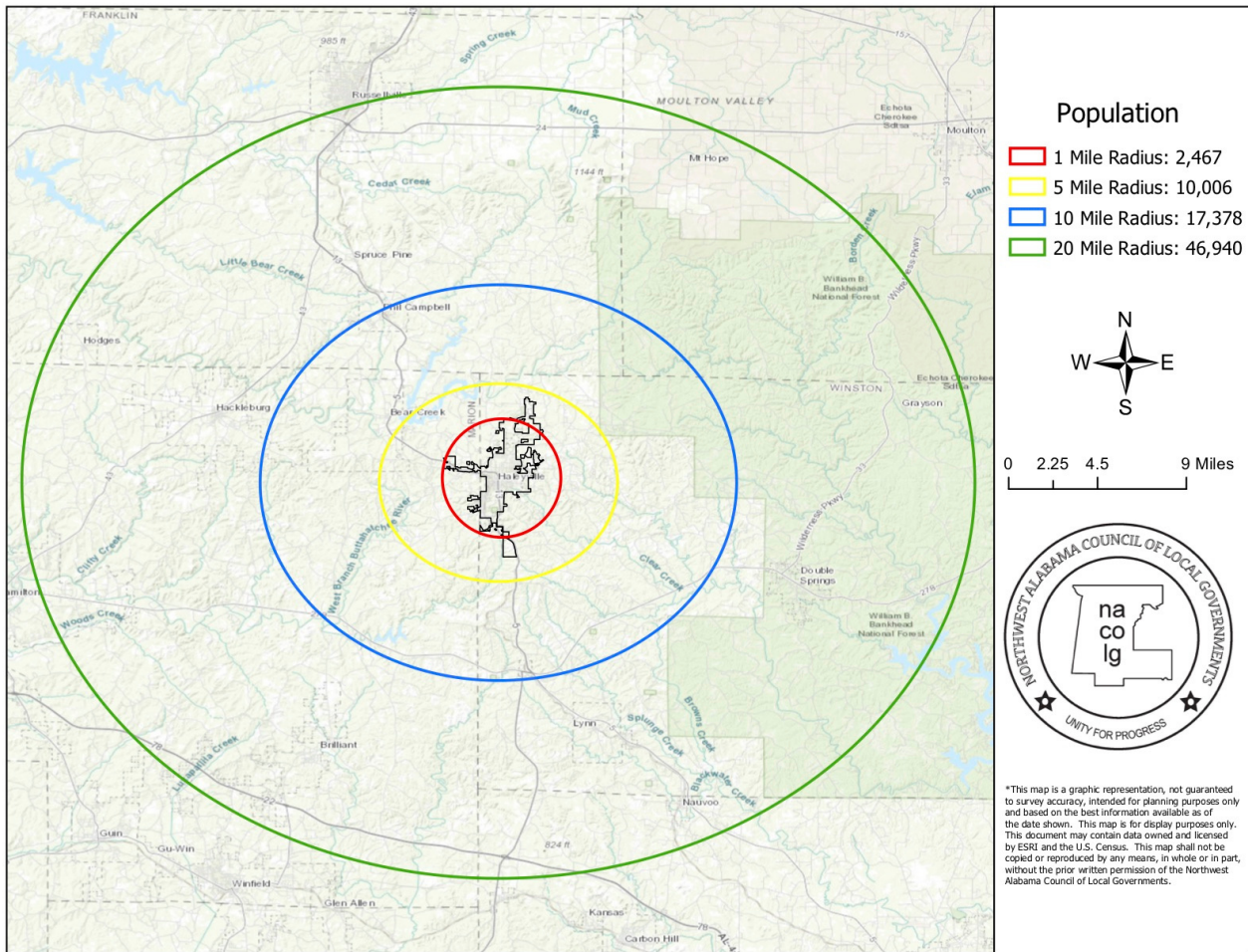

9-1-1 Call History

U.S. Rep. Tom Bevill, in Haleyville, became the first person in the United States to answer a 911 emergency phone call. Alabama Speaker of the House Rankin Fite placed the call from Haleyville City Hall in 1968, and Bevill answered from the city's police station with "Hello." The phone call, in an attempt by Alabama Telephone Company to be the first to implement the system, occurred only 35 days after AT&T announced plans to use 911 as a nationwide emergency number. The bright red phone used to answer the call is now on display in the lobby of Haleyville City Hall.

Winston County is encircled with a strong community college presence and accordingly, we have worked to utilize the community college system to partner in workforce training efforts.

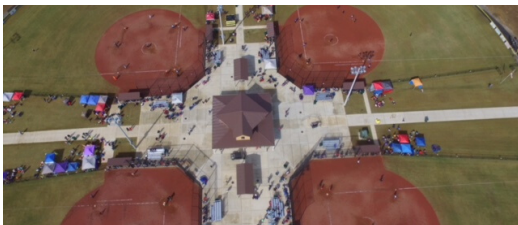


Haleyville Parks AND RECREATION DEPARTMENT

The six lane, 25 yard swimming pool is ADA accessible with a lowering chair for those with disabilities. ROCKY RAVINE PARK

Rocky Ravine can be accessed from Highway 195 or 20th Street. The 140 acre park is made up of walking trails, hiking trails, picnic areas, fishing, waterfalls and full of wonderful things to see in this very serene setting right in the heart of town. Rocky Ravine has a small playground, swings, and is a natural gorge with a flowing stream.



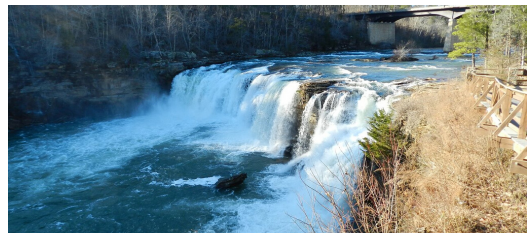
CITY LAKE PARK

Scenic City Lake in Haleyville is open year around and offers fishing, hiking trails and waterfalls. There is an annual drive-thru Christmas Lights Show sponsored by the Haleyville Fire Department. City Lake also has a great playground.



BEAR CREEK RESERVOIR

Upper Bear Creek Reservoir is renowned for its trophy bass fishing. Fish over 5 pounds are common, with 8 pound and larger bass being taken each year. According to the 1995-2005 Alabama B.A.I.T. reports, Upper Bear has been ranked first-5 times and second-3 times, for the least number of angling hours exerted to catch a bass in excess of 5 pounds. Enjoy camping, fishing, lodging, boating, and swimming.



HALEYVILLE COUNTRY CLUB

Haleyville has an golf course located at the Haleyville Country Club on Airport Road. The club also operates a pro shop with golfing supplies. 18 Holes over 5881 yards with a par of 70 (Private Equity Facility).

Bankhead National Forest

AND THE SIPSEY WILDERNESS

There are numerous recreational sites available in the Bankhead National Forest and the Sipsey Wilderness area, all are within easy driving distance from the City of Haleyville. Bankhead is also home to Alabama's largest tree, a Yellow Poplar approximately 150 feet tall and takes about four grown men to encircle its circumference. Fishing, camping, hiking, swimming, backpacking, boat launches, canoe launches, waterfalls and beaches are available throughout the forest.



Lewis Smith Lake

Lewis Smith Lake, a 45 minute drive from Haleyville, impounds approximately 21,000 acres, with over 500 miles of shoreline. Smith Lake is a deep, clear lake with feeder streams, bays and sloughs. Steep bluffs cradle much of the lake, with water depths dropping as deep as 60 to 70 feet just a few yards offshore. The lake is highly rated in the state as a trophy saltwater striped bass fishery.

HALEYVILLE FARMERS MARKET

If you are visiting Haleyville during the summer months, the Haleyville Farmers Market is the place to go for fresh fruit and vegetables grown by area producers. The market sponsored by the City of Haleyville, Winston County Extension and the Winston County Commission. Located at Rocky Ravine Park, they are open from June until October from 6:00 AM – Noon, Tuesday, Thursday & Saturday.



HALEYVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY

The Haleyville Public Library's mission is to provide residents of Haleyville and outlying areas with effective library services for their educational, informational, and recreational use. The 3,025 square foot library facility, located on 20th Street, is funded by the City of Haleyville. The library is also a member of the Carl Elliott Regional Library System.

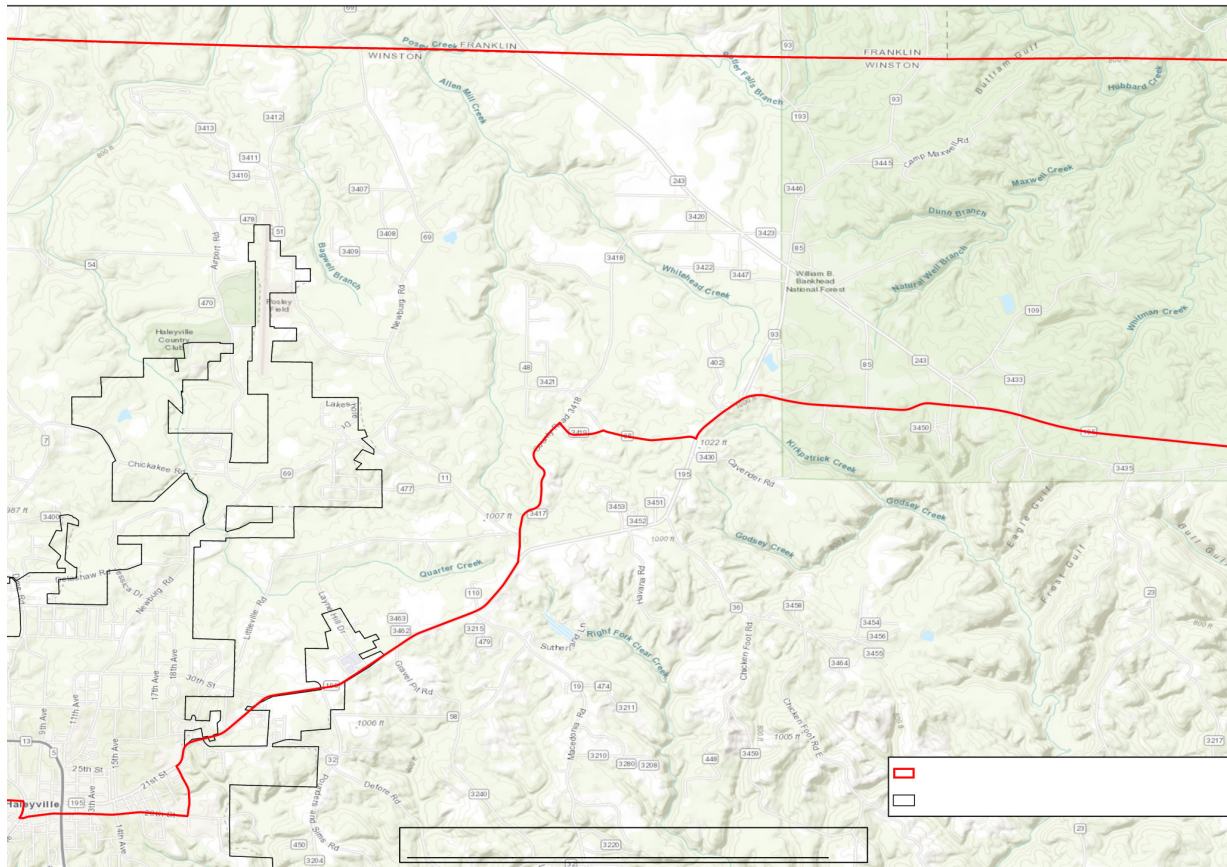


Opportunity Zones

City of Haleyville Approved Opportunity Zones

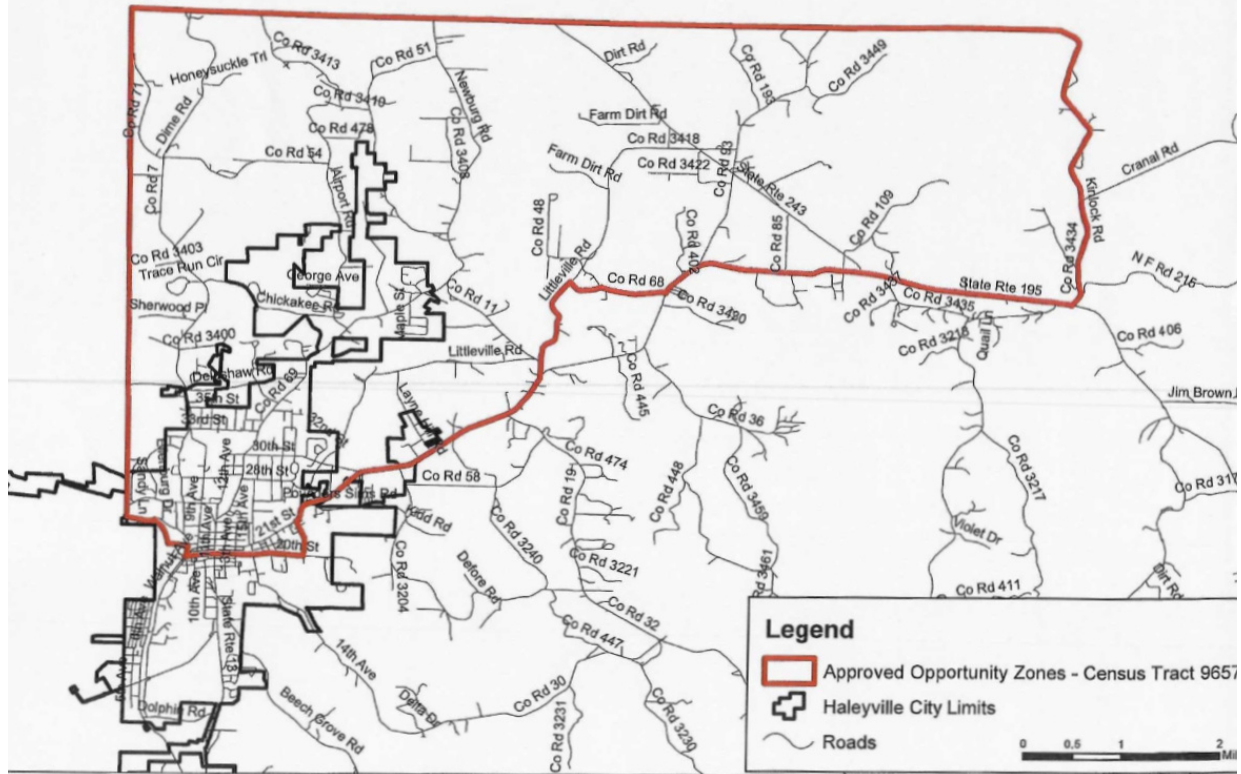

Governor Kay Ivey's Office, with the help of the Alabama Department of Economic and Community Affairs, identified and selected Opportunity Zones from qualifying tracts. Methods used in the selection process included a county-by-county examination of previous designations as advantage sites or industrial sites, a review of aerial imagery for development activities by ADECA's Geographical Information Systems Unit and data and research compiled by federal, state and local organizations.

Governor Ivey submitted Alabama's nominations for Opportunity Zones to the U.S. Department of the Treasury on March 20, 2018. The zones were approved by the Treasury Department and the IRS on April 18, 2018.
